Taking into account the prospective scenario, a wide-raging project have been chalked out to protect the Sikh youth from the menace of drugs, intoxicants and conversions by imparting them Gatka training, basic learning of Gurbani, Gurmat & Gurmukhi, tying of Dastar & Dumala besides imbibing character/nation building qualities through field practices, virtual meetings, webinars and seminars.

During training the practitioners can be provided refreshment based on the nutritional requirement. Gatka being a recognised sport in Punjab, the 'Gatkebaaz' can avail opportunities while recruitment in government jobs or get admissions in professional institutions through sports quota. Besides, the Gatka coaches/trainers will get jobs in such centres and the learners (Gatkai) can also earn livelihood as instructors/trainers after getting this training.

It is needless to mention that such extensive projects cannot be implemented single-handily. We, therefore, seek the co-operation and assistance of all to preserve and promote rich Sikh cultural traditions. It is therefore requested to kindly join in our campaign in whatever manner possible for the sake of stopping of our youth from drifting away from Sikhi.

As proposed, everyone can support/help the endeavour for providing ground/space (Measuring 4,000 Sq/ft or 500 Sq/yrd approx) for Gatka training and one small room (Approx 12x12 ft) for storing Gatka equipment in any educational institute, Gurdwara, bhawan, house or can help the children by donating them Dastars, Dumalas, Bana (Chola), sports shoes, Gatka equipment or monthly salary to the Gursikh trainer etc.

We request all like-minded people to extend all support in this regard and looking forward for your response to help in this humble mission.
